Strategies

Together we will:

- Implement visible learning approaches within all learning areas
- Explicitly integrate deep learning approaches in teaching practices
- Use coaching approaches to ensure quality teaching strategies are consistently used
- Differentiate teaching and learning experiences to meet individual student needs
- Collect, analyse and use targeted data to inform teaching and learning
- Build a culture that promotes learning for all students, teachers and leaders

Priority 2

21st Century Learning Environment

Strategies

Together we will:

NAPLAN (Reading)

Students in the Top 20 % of WA Public Schools and among Like Schools to be equal to or higher than Like Schools i.e. 30% or higher.

Student Engagement

Reduce the percentage of students with an average of 'seldom' or 'sometimes' across the eight attitude, behaviour and effort categories.

Culture

Be welcoming, friendly, knowledgeable, approachable, community minded and student focused - evidenced by school culture surveys.
